Evaluative Techniques:

Many evaluations processes will be used to assess students' work. These include homework, notebook checks, quizzes, and class work. Benchmark exams are scheduled for December and May and each will count for a test grade.

Grading Policy:

Homework Policy:

The intent of homework is to extend and reinforce learning and prepare the student for the upcoming class lesson. It is to the student's benefit in math that they practice each problem using their notes as a guide in solving difficult problems. Homework will be assigned regularly and checked routinely.

Late Work:

Late work is any assignment or project that is not turned in, despite that fact that *the student was in attendance* on assignment day and the due date. Late work <u>must be turned in, but will not be evaluated for a grade</u>.

Make-up Work:

Make-up work is any assignment or project for *which the student was absent* either on the date that it was assigned or on the date that it was due.
